We are celebrating a milestone this year! What began as a small, grass roots initiative in 1974 has grown into an organization that serves people living with developmental disabilities, mental health challenges, and acquired brain injury in Metro Vancouver, the Fraser Valley, and Vancouver Island.

We really want to take the whole year to celebrate our past, engage with our communities, and dream about what the future can hold for people of all abilities.

Our theme for the year is 'Our story. Our Community. Our Future' and our year-long celebrations will reflect these themes. Rather than focus on one celebratory day, we will hold a variety of events that will bring the Communitas family together from each community in which we are present.

We hope you'll join us for our open house events in Abbotsford and Campbell River. Each of our



homes and services will also have the opportunity to invite their neighbours, friends, and family to smaller, more intimate gatherings. The year will culminate with an event at The Reach Gallery Museum in Abbotsford.

We've also produced five short films, each one focused on a different aspect of the organization's area of service. You'll find these films on the Timeline on our website and live screenings are also being planned.

Welcome to our *Spring 2024 FOCUS* and welcome to a year of celebrations with Communitas Supportive Care. For fifty years now, our organization has supported communities, families and people of all abilities *In the Name of Christ*.

Our humble beginnings with the Samaritan Society for Comfort and Cheer, started as a response to parents who were advocating for non-institutional support models for their children. In partnership with MCC-BC, the work expanded rapidly, embracing de-institutionalization,

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establishing homes in various communities across BC and creating inclusive services that looked beyond the sheltered workshops of the day. In 1992, we registered as a separate legal entity called MCC Supportive Care Services, and in 2007 the name, Communitas, was adopted, identifying us as a 'place where all people were equal.'
