

These homes could not have been built without the support of donors who gave to our Communitas 50 Fund last year. Matt Dirks is ficer. He explains that building new homes was a new experience for the organization, but with limited options that would truly meet the needs of the people we serve, this project became critical.

"The concept of home is deeply personal, and housing is a pressing issue across our province. Challenges like supply shortages affordability, and policy debates with proposed solutions-smaller footprints, faster approvals, higher density builds, or cost-cutting materials," Matt says. "While well-intended, these choices shape what gets built, often overlooking accessibility for people with

By contributing to this project, donors helped Communitas create places that people will truly call home.

"We are incredibly grateful to the donors who gave towards the Communitas50 Fund last year and the inclusive housing initiatives," Matt says. "We are excited to continue exploring ways to move accessibility ahead on the housing agenda."

Kelly found it very challenging to provide the 24/7 care that Jadacey required. When Jadacey was able to move into one of Communitas' homes, it was both a relief and bittersweet for

"I wanted to be able to do everything for my daughter but it just isn't possible for one person to do it all," Kelly reflects. "Knowing that my daughter is in a safe home with people who love and care for her has made a huge difference to us both."

Kelly continues to be an integral part of Jadacey's life, visiting her whenever she can. Their story underlines the importance of having a place to call home - not just a house to live in, but a home where one belongs.

Last year, Communitas took on the project of building two new homes. Built by Stattonrock Design and Build, these homes replaced one aging home owned by Communitas that had been vacant for nearly a year as it was no longer a suitable home for people living with disabilities. That home was removed by Nickel Brothers and will go to a new owner. The lot was already zoned for two houses, giving Communitas the opportunity to build homes specifically designed for the eight people who moved into these homes in February. Jadacey was one of those people.

Kelly and Jadacey were able to tour Jadacey's new home just before she and her housemates moved in. The home is bright and spacious. It is equipped with all the things that are needed

when you live with a disability: extra ceilings, an accessible bathtub, and lower counter tops. All of these amenities are tastefully created so that this home does not feel like an institution. That's important to Kelly.

"I appreciate that this home has everything Jadacey needs but I really like the homey atmosphere," Kelly says. "I love the nice patio out back. I can see them sitting around a fire pit there or enjoying meals in the summer."

Kelly is grateful that her daughter is able to move into such a beautiful home.

"I feel like we won the lottery," Kelly says, with a smile. "I know that Jadacey will be safe but I also know that she will be loved and cared for. That's what matters most.





What's new at Little Sprout Café?


